

If you are interested in participating in the performance portion, please read the information and guidelines carefully. We are excited to see students' creativity and talent and would like the show to be fun and family-oriented. Please review the following checklist as you prepare:

- Dancing and music choices should be family-friendly. Examples would include most Christian, classical, patriotic, jazz, or folk genres.
- · For your audition, please have music (CDs, sheet music, flash drive, or phone) with you, and ready.
- If you would like to use live background music (piano accompaniment), please make us aware of this
 prior to the audition.
- We ask that each student audition with only one solo performance. Exceptions may be considered at our discretion – please contact us. This does not exclude you from auditioning as part of a group as well.
- Some considerations for your act:
 - o Is the act/song suitable for an ALL ages? Would it be appropriate for a "rated G" audience?
 - Is the subject matter, including lyries, too mature or inappropriate for an "open house" setting, even if treated in a Christian light?

Time Commitment:

Rehearsals will be scheduled once a week for the last 3 weeks of April (Mondays, Thursdays, or Fridays). Practices are minimal and will include a short time (5-10 minutes) each week and a dress rehearsal TBD. You will be given a 5-10 minute time slot one of those three days that accommodates your family/sports schedule after school.
